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

From Isolation to Intamacy "making relationships possible"

Many of you (our supporters) are married and have experienced long successful marriages. However, I suspect this might not have been the case had you been diagnosed with severe mental illness or been subjected to life below the poverty line. Chances are, your marriage might not have survived.



One of the most heartbreaking effects experienced by those who suffer from mental illness is the difficulty developing and maintaining healthy relationships. The majority of individuals the Well serves are single and have either never married or have experienced multiple failed relationships and in some cases divorce. Sadly, this is typical for those with severe mental illness. A multinational study of mental disorders, marriage and divorce published in 2011 found that a sample of 18 mental disorders all increased the likelihood of relationship failure.

However, this does not have to be the case. Let me share with you a story about a married couple from the Well. Longtime community members, John and Tania Ward, were married at the Well four years ago, but recently felt called to

recommit and celebrate their marital vows. Brent McDougal, Pastor of Cliff Temple, presided over the ceremony and I had the privilege of being John's best man. Read Hatley, staff member, was John's groomsmen and longtime supporter of the Well and board member, Scott Coleman, gave Tania away. It was a beautiful moment in the life of the Well and one of joy for all who participated. John and Tania's marriage is an immense encouragement to me and is a shining example of what a marriage was designed to look like. continually amazed by how they care for one another.

Their love is selfless and they seem to take particular pleasure in serving one another. I am confident John and Tania's marriage is not completely free of conflict, however I have never even seen a hint of tension as I observe them interact. Both are profoundly physically and mentally disabled, but together they are strong and continue to be two of the most influential and capable members of the Well Community. Though it should be irrelevant, for me it is icing on the cake that Tania is white and John is an African-American.

One of my first encounters with Tania (almost eight years ago) came when I pulled over to the side of the road after seeing Dallas police surrounding her on Jefferson St., as she had been panhandling. I intervened and the police allowed her to leave with me. While driving back to the Well's Community Life Center, Tania confessed her crack cocaine addiction and teared up as she expressed her weariness and despair.

Today, Tania has been clean and sober for many years and is a loving and faithful wife and "mother" to many of our younger community members. John and Tania met at the Well and Tania regularly testifies of God's goodness, giving Him credit for her sobriety and for leading her to the Well, where for the first time in her life she was able to develop healthy/intimate relationships. Though John and Tanya clearly have a strong comment to one another, I would contend that their marital success has had more to do with the strong commitment of the supportive community that surrounds them.

While life can be immensely challenging, the joy experiencing intimacy with others provides, can make tackling life's challenges seem worth it. Never has this been more true than for members of the Well. Your continued support has made possible examples like John and Tania's. The Well is committed to reversing the destructive power of loneliness and isolation and supporters like you are helping to make that a reality.
